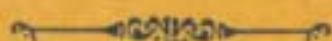

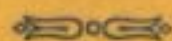

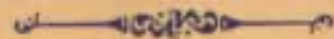

RULES AND REGULATIONS COVERING TWO-HOUR TEAM RACE

No laps to be gained in the first half hour of the race.

All pickups or changes must be made on the home-stretch in full view of the judges.

There will be a whistle blown denoting the beginning of each mile sprint for points, and no changes will be made after whistle is blown. A bell will ring at one lap to go for the sprint.

There will be a one-mile sprint for a prize at one-half hour after start of race and at intervals of 15 minutes during first hour of race. In the last hour of the race there will be a sprint at every three miles (6 laps) for points which will count 6—4—3—2—1. The team with the most number of points will be winner if there is no team a lap ahead.

—ACCIDENTS—

In case of a puncture or other accident to his bike, a rider must not be off the track more than two laps or else must be relieved by his team mate. The damaged wheel must be shown at once to the acting referee or his assistant.

An accident in the form of a puncture, a broken handlebar, a broken chain, or a broken pedal, may, in the judgment of the referee, result in the loss of no laps in the score.

It is hereby agreed that the Century Road Club of America, or the St. Louis Park Commissioner assumes no responsibility whatsoever for accidents or injuries which may occur to competitors or spectators during the race prior or subsequent thereto.

SPECTATORS are respectfully requested to cooperate with the promoting organization and officials by not crossing track while race is in progress; by preventing children, etc., from straying or getting in front of cyclists who would be unable to avoid giving or receiving serious injury.
